
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


Explaining MSCI Climate Metrics






Forward-looking vs backward looking climate metrics

Net-zero implementation only using backward looking data




Realized path requires frequent adjustments

Net-zero implementation only using forward looking data



Realized path can drift away from target pathway because forward-looking data is not perfectly predictive of the future

Net-zero implementation using forward-looking and backward-looking data



Realized path is smoother due to steering the portfolio toward self-decarbonizing companies



What climate metrics shall I use to track my carbon footprint?

Each climate metric answers a slightly different question:

Financed emissions = emissions "owned" by the portfolio:

How much GHG emissions am I financing? [t CO2e]

Financed emissions intensity (FEI) = weighted emissions / EVIC:

How much GHG emissions am I financing per dollar invested? [t CO2e / USD]


Weighted average carbon intensity (WACI) = weighted emissions / Sales:

How carbon intense are the business models of the companies that I am invested in? [t CO2e / USD]



Tracking portfolio carbon footprint

Using financed emissions




Volatility due to

- Changes in companies' financing structure

Using financed emissions intensity (FEI)






Volatility due to


- Market volatility, especially equity markets
- Changes in EVIC




Disentangling the main effects in Financed Emissions Intensities


